EQUALITY OBJECTIVES

There are two specific duties. These are that schools should:

- Publish information which shows compliance with the PSED
- Publish at least one equality objective

The specific duties are meant to help schools and public bodies fulfil their obligations under the general duty

By 6 April 2012 the specific duties require schools to have published information showing compliance with the public sector equality duty, plus also at least one equality objective.

This published information will need to be updated annually and objectives published every four years.
