PP is to be used to achieve the above by investing it in:

£6,000 -staffing for 1:1 in English and Maths; academic and social learning. Achieve 3000 to improve Literacy, reading for understanding; School Counsellor for emotional well being & reducing stress at Exams.

£7,000 College Courses: a contribution to college courses for KS 4 students who have aspirations in curriculum areas that KSSS can't provide eg. Engineering Level 1; Animal Management Level 1; Creative Industries Level 1; Multi Craft Construction City & Guilds & non qualification enrichment; Hair & Beauty Level 1.



£600 – IAG staffing; 1:1 careers planning, application & interview techniques; attend FE & POST 16 providers; attend careers fairs

£800K Alternative Provision – Eagles Nest; Build a Bike; Physical problem solving & team building; Residential.

£200 – Work Experience placements, H&S checks, monitoring visits; etc.

£200 – Zoo lab, animal care; Rubicon, Scooting; Wheelchair Basketball etc.

£500 - for curriculum areas to bid for additional resources / events to personalise PP students to access their curriculum area.

Total: £15,300 KSSS will needed to pay the travel costs for the off site events and the rest of the above funding.
