£6,400 -staffing for 1:1 in English and Maths (academic progress) and School Counsellor (for emotional Well-Being);

 \pm 3,990 IT support to enhance learning in the home – use of school laptops; software, internet access etc. With DfE support – all students had a better grade of laptop.

£6,000 College Courses: a contribution to college courses for KS 4 students who have aspirations in curriculum areas that KSSS can't provide eg. Engineering Level 1; Animal Management Level 1; Creative Industries Level 1; Multi Craft Construction City & Guilds & non qualification enrichment; Hair & Beauty Level 1.

£800 – IAG staffing; 1:1 careers planning, application & interview techniques; attend FE & POST 16 providers; attend careers fairs/ access virtual careers events etc

Total: £18,002: KSSS will needed to pay the travel costs for the offsite events. TRAVEL costs: £812 paid for by KSSS budget.
